Williamson Shooting Sports Complex and Camp Garland Cub Scout Ranges District & Council Events

- Read and be familiar with current WSSC Standard Operating Procedures.
- WSSC Rifle Range (Rifle) 14 shooting positions requiring a minimum of one currently-certified NRA Range Safety Officer per each 8 shooters and one currently-certified NRA Rifle Instructor per each 8 shooters.
- WSSC Rifle Range (Pistol VENTURING ONLY) Max.14 shooting positions requiring a minimum of one currently-certified NRA Range Safety Officer per each 3 shooters and one currently-certified NRA Pistol Instructor per each shooter. (7 revolvers + 7 semiauto available)
- WSSC Rifle Range (Muzzleloading Rifle) Max. 8 shooting positions requiring a minimum of one currently-certified NRA Range Safety Officer per each 8 shooters and one currently-certified NRA Muzzleloading Rifle or NMLRA Instructor per each shooter. (5 muzzleloading rifles available)
- Only one discipline (rifle, muzzleloading rifle, pistol) may be fired on the rifle range at a given time. (No mixed discipline firing.)
- WSSC Shotgun Range can be set up to have 6 shooters on 3 traps presenting straightaway targets and will require one currently-certified NRA Range Safety Officer per each 6 shooters and one currently-certified NRA Shotgun Instructor per active shooter.
- WSSC Archery Range 12 shooting positions requiring a minimum of one currently-certified USA Archery Level 1 Instructor, who is 18 years of age or older, per each 8 shooters.
- WSSC ranges are limited to use by Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, and Venturers and adult scouters ONLY.
 No Cub Scouts or Webelos.
- At least one person who has completed the Williamson Shooting Sports Complex Facility Orientation
 must be on-site while WSSC is in use.
- The "old" rifle range is closed.
- No personal or unit firearms or personal or unit archery equipment may be used at WSSC or Camp ranges during district or council events.
- No personal, unit, or district ammunition or targets/clays may be used at district events at WSSC.
 Use only WSSC supplied ammunition and targets/clays.
- Cub Scout BB range at Camp Garland 8 shooting positions requiring a minimum of one Cub Scout BB & Archery Rangemaster with a currently-valid card per each 8 shooters.
- Cub Scout Archery range at Camp Garland 8 shooting positions requiring a minimum of one Cub Scout BB & Archery Rangemaster with a currently-valid card per each 8 shooters.
 - A currently-certified NRA Rifle Instructor can serve as a Cub Scout BB Rangemaster and a USA Archery Level 1 Instructor can serve as a Cub Scout Archery Rangemaster (per each 8 shooters on each range).
 - A currently-certified NRA Range Safety Officer CANNOT serve as a Cub Scout BB or Archery Rangemaster unless they have completed a Cub Scout BB & Archery Rangemaster course and have a currently valid card.
- Tiger Cubs and their adult partners may participate in BB gun shooting and archery activities. The adult partners must be included in all shooting activities. Each Tiger Cub must be paired with his adult partner before being allowed to shoot.
- Lions may not participate in shooting sports.

- Check-in and Check-out procedure:
 - Have copies of (1) WSSC District/Council Event Reservation form, (2) WSSC District/Council Event Instructor/RSO Certification form with copies of NRA RSOs, NRA Instructors, USA Archery Level 1 Instructors, and WSSC Facility Orientation current certification cards.
 - Have copies of Garland Cub Scout Ranges form and current Cub Scout BB & Archery Rangemaster cards for Garland BB & Archery ranges.
 - Ranger Jack Moffit will check in range personnel and issue ammunition. He will open rifle/shotgun building and archery building. These buildings must be closed and locked with range keys when RSOs/Instructors are not on the ranges.
- Firearms may be discharged only between the hours of 09:00 and 17:00.
- Check-out procedures must be followed. Ranger Jack Moffit will review Check-Out Logs for each range and check in any unused ammunition and clays.
 - All firearms used must be cleaned by range personnel prior to check-out.

Administration

- Staff Advisor will be responsible for checking out WSSC venue tickets from INC Accounting.
 - At the event, tickets should be distributed to participants at the event administration center. No cash sales at the ranges.
 - o Tickets are marked for quantity of shots per ticket at each range.
 - As each ticket is collected at the ranges, mark the range (R-Rifle, S-Shotgun, A-Archery) where it
 was collected and place the ticket in the ticket container.
 - o At the end of the event, count all tickets for each range to compare with ammunition used.
 - The Staff Advisor will return an unissued tickets to INC Accounting.
- Count all Webelos/Cub Scouts using the Camp Garland BB & Archery ranges.
- WSSC Archery range upon entry into range, stamp scout's hand with stamp provided so scout may reenter range without additional ticket. (One ticket for all-day use.)
- Use 48" (122cm.) target faces on target butts for district events.
- BSA Safety Briefings (pistol for Venturers only; rifle, shotgun)must be taught prior to shooting at WSSC. Some form of identification (wrist bands, stamp) must be used to identify those that have completed the training.
- If you have more than one program group (Cub Scout/Webelos, Boy Scouts, and/or Venturing) use different colored wrist bands to identify them.
- Districts will be responsible for furnishing wrist bands to all Webelos/Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts/Varsity Scouts, and Venturing Scouts. These program groups must have different colored wrist bands to distinguish them.
- At the range: Every shooter must wear ear and eye protection on the Rifle and Shotgun ranges. Eye
 protection must be sanitized before a new user wears them. Each shooter will be issued only one pair of
 disposable ear protection.
- Additional personnel for ranges:
 - Check-in and crowd control.
 - Issue safety glasses and ear protection on rifle and shotgun ranges.
 - Fill ammunition blocks on rifle range. Issue ammunition and collect and validate tickets.
 - Size bows and arrows and issue to shooters. Issue armguards, fingertabs, and quivers to shooters.
 Collect quivers with arrows, armguards, and fingertabs when shooters are departing range.
